

Survivors include his wife, Gail, also a long-time member of the photo club; his children Paul Dohrmann and Lisa Sinclair; his grandchildren, Lucy and Emma Sinclair; and siblings Arlan Dohrmann, Mary Lea Dohrmann and Susan Unger.

He had been a systems engineer in computer science and worked at the Comput-



ing Center at CU, Ciber, Hughes Aircraft, and Boeing.

His world travel included France, Netherlands, Italy, Morocco, Croatia, Portugal, Spain, Mexico and Cuba, partly for the photography and partly for the food.

Russ and Gail published two books, "Best Boulder Region Hiking Trails" and "Boulder's Favorite Places," which were local bestsellers.
